In response to 2010 Pakistan floods, Sungi Development Foundation had launched its relief and humanitarian assistance campaign in different flood affected areas of Pakistan. As part of the campaign, Sungi had entered into an agreement with United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs-UN OCHA to provide humanitarian assistance to flood affected population of Tamboo tehsil of district Naseerabad in Baluchistan. According to an estimate, more than 30,000 people have been made homeless in Tamboo tehsil as flash flood entered the tehsil destroying livelihoods, and infrastructure, forced people to live under open sky without adequate food and safe drinking water. The project aimed at improving access of safe drinking water, sanitation and hygiene facilities to 2400 families of three union councils (Allahabad, Abdullah Bari, Manjhu Shori) of tehsil Tamboo on short term basis. During the project implementation period (Nov-2010 to Feb-2011) Sungi provided health & hygiene kits to 2400 families, also constructed 500 pit latrines and installed 117 filter hand pumps to provide safe drinking water to 3500 flood affected families. To improve the health & hygiene practices of the people our teams also conducted 390 health & hygiene sessions in three union councils.
